

# Be a responsible diver and snorkeller

before you go

**Check the conditions.** Be aware of water temperatures, currents, and weather forecasts before you leave.

**Take a friend.** Never dive or snorkel alone and always tell people where you are going.

**Know who to contact.** Find out where the nearest medical facility is and note down who to contact in an emergency.

at the beach

**Know your surroundings.** Check what the weather is doing and identify a landmark for reference.

**Use the right equipment.** Only use good quality and well-fitting equipment.

**Wear the right protection.** Wear a wetsuit if you tend to get cold and always remember to wear coral-safe sunscreen!

in the water

**Follow the snorkellers Code.**

Do not remove plants or animals from the rocks or from their homes.

Take care not to kick sealife with fins or stand on coral or other delicate sealife.

Observe animals where they live and don't take anything away with you.

Do not anchor your boat - always use the mooring buoys.

Be aware of boats on the water.

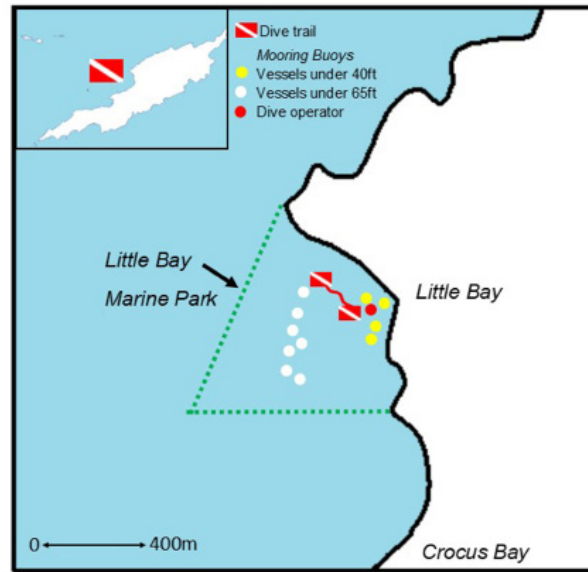

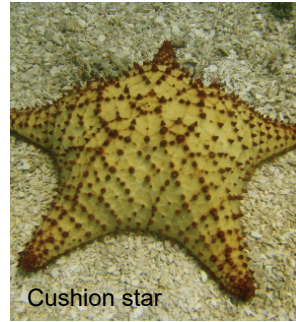

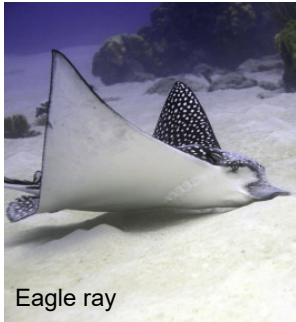
